Book guides hikers through trail

Manual to coincide with 25th anniversary of Maitland Trail Assoc.

Maitland Trail enthusiasts can now navigate the trail with the help of a new Trail Guide.

The 44-page book is the first comprehensive guide to the trail and is being published to coincide with the 25th anniversary of the Maitland Trail.

The trail guide was officially unveiled on Sunday afternoon before a crowd of about 50 people at the old CPR Station across from Main Beach in Goderich.

The trail guide was largely the work of Dan Holm, of Hensall, and Patrick Donnelly, of St. Marys. The two intrepid hikers walked the entire 45-km length of the trail twice over the past two years in preparation of the
