

Falls Reserve CA opens

For many vacationers, the ideal summer includes camping, fishing, hiking and swimming. Set along the scenic Maitland River, in Benmiller and just minutes from Goderich, Falls Reserve Conservation Area offers a combination of family camping in a beautiful natural setting. The conservation area opens on April 17.

The park's 230 acres are nearly enclosed by the winding Maitland River. The wide shallow Maitland cascades over a series of low waterfalls as it flows past the park. A few minutes from the campsites, the forests of the park offer the kind of solitude that few places in Southern Ontario can match. Many visitors enjoy the salmon, trout and bass fishing and hiking the

Maitland Trail along the river and the forests of the park.

The park has 185 campsites. These include fully serviced, underserviced and seasonal sites.

The proximity of the park to Goderich shopping and restaurants, the Blyth Festival Theatre and the Benmiller Inn make it particularly attractive to those travelling from a distance," said Geoff King, superintendent of the park.

For a reasonable fee the pavilion and other picnic areas can be reserved for gatherings. The large open spaces are ideal for volleyball, baseball, soccer or kicking a football. With a day use pass, many local people visit the park for a day of swimming, playing games, or just for a picnic with friends or

relatives.

The large, covered pavilion allows planned events to continue even if the weather conditions are not ideal.

Local and out-of-county visitors enjoy the summer special events. The fishing derby on July 4 is part of the family fishing weekend. The annual Car and Craft show on Aug. 1 and 2 and Fiddling at the Falls on Aug. 8 are expected to attract many visitors.

The Falls Reserve Conservation Area is owned by the Maitland Valley Conservation Authority. It is located in Benmiller at the junction of county roads 1 and 31. For more information or to make a camping reservation, call the FRCA at (519) 524-6429.
